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The evaluation of students in a course for all 4-year B.Tech. programme (8-Semesters), Lateral Entry students of B.Tech. programme (6-Semesters), 2-year M.Tech. Programme (4-Semesters) and 2-Year MBA Programme (4-Semesters) is a continuous process and is based on their performance in different examinations mentioned below:

- (a) Sessional, involving Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) conducted all through the semester which includes Mid Semester Examinations and assessment (TA) through assignments.
- (b) Terminal, often designated as ESE includes a written examination for theory courses and a practical / design/drawing examination with built-in oral part for laboratory/design/drawing courses.
 - A student's performance in a course (subject) shall be judged by taking into account the result of CIE and ESE together.
 - CIE and ESE shall have 40:60 weightage i.e., CIE having 40% weightage and ESE having 60%weightage.

Distribution is given to each component of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) for the Theory course:

- 1) Teacher's Assessment: 10%
- 2) Mid Semester Examination (MSE-1 & MSE-2): 30%
- 3) Total weightage: 40%

TA Marks (or weighted average of TA marks)

- There shall be Two assignments and Two Minor exams for each course at regular intervals of time

Calculation of Average of TAmarks:

- The average of marks secured in two assignments and two minor examinations was taken under TA.

MSE Marks (or weighted average of MSE marks)

- There shall be Two MSE examinations in a semester
- Maximum marks for each Mid Semester Examination is 30

Calculation of MSE marks:
