**Exam Fee Notification for Post-Graduation One-Time Make-up chance for MSE (OTM-MSE) Improvement in the courses failed due to low MSE marks.**

**(Applicable for M.Tech & MBA, admitted in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 & 2021)**

**Last date to apply for OTM-MSE: 13-04-2024**  
**(Collect application form from the examination branch)**

It is to inform the students of M.Tech & MBA batches, admitted in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 & 2021 that, **One-time make-up (OTM)** chance is given to improve MSE marks to those candidates who have completed their course work, but did not pass some of courses in the end semester examinations **due to less internal (MSE) marks** than **specified marks (09 for PRR-14 and 07 for PRR-20)** as approved by the Academic Council.

In this connection, the students of M.Tech & MBA batches, who have completed their course work (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 & 2021 admitted batches) but did not pass some of the courses in the end semester examination, due to less internal (MSE) marks than the specified marks **(09 for PRR-14 and 07 for PRR-20)**, are informed **to apply by collecting the application form from the Examination Branch of KITSW**. The duly filled-in form should be submitted to the examination branch of KITSW on or before **13-04-2024**.

The detailed schedule of the examination for **MSE improvement** will be released and notified shortly.

**Note:**

1. The students who secured internal marks less than the marks specified **(09 for PRR-14 and 07 for PRR-20)** are only eligible to write the exam for MSE improvement.
2. **The students can only avail one time chance for improving the internal marks and cannot appear for the subsequent notifications thereafter, if applied, the application will be treated as invalid.**
3. The students **(2020 & 2021 batches only)** who, after completion of his/her M.Tech & MBA IV Semester course work, but not **COMPLETED THE STIPULATED PERIOD** (double the duration of the course), failed to clear ESE in some theory courses due to low Mid Semester Examinations (MSE) marks, shall be given ONE-TIME MAKEUP (OTM) chance to improve marks in MSE (OTM-MSE) for those courses
4. The STUDENTS **(2014,2015,2016,2017,2018 and 2019 Batches) WHO COMPLETED THE STIPULATED PERIOD** (double the duration of course), and not completed their M.Tech./MBA programme need to re-register for the programme by taking permission from Principal

**Low MSE marks means marks less than 35% of max. marks of MSE.**

5. For improvement in MSE, the student has to take **either MSE-I or MSE-II of 2-hour duration**.
6. The evaluation of OTM-MSE improvement shall be done as given below for the students as per the batches admitted under PRR14 and PRR20 regulations:

**A. For students admitted under PRR14 Regulation:**

**Max. Marks = 25:**  
**Pass Marks =**  $\begin{cases} 9 \text{ marks; if the candidate has a minimum of 5 marks in TA out of 15} \\ 14 \text{ marks; if the candidate has ZERO marks in TA out of 15} \end{cases}$

- (i) **BEST MSE MARKS**= max (OTM-MSE marks, previous marks in MSE in which the candidate took OTM-MSE)
- (ii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS**= Average (Best MSE marks, other MSE marks)
- (iii) The **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing during permissible years.

**Example:** Considering a case where a student has secured 5 marks in MSE-1 and 9 marks in MSE-2. The average of MSE-1 and MSE-2 taken together is 7 marks, which is less than the marks specified.  
If the student chooses to appear OTM-MSE in MSE-1 and secures 18 marks in OTM-MSE, the evaluation shall be done as below:

- (i) **BEST MSE MARKS** = max (18, 5) = 18 marks
- (ii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** = Average (18 (Best MSE), 9(Previous MSE-2 marks)) = 13.5 marks
- (iii) This **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** (13.5) shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing during permissible years.

**MINIMUM REQUIREMENT OF PASSING A COURSE:**

A student is deemed to have passed a Theory course, if he/she secures

- (i) 35% of marks assigned to the End Semester Examination (ESE) and
- (ii) 35% of marks assigned to the Mid Semester Examination (MSE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) of the course taken together.
- (iii) 35% of marks assigned to Teacher's Assessment (TA), Mid Semester Examination (MSE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) of the course taken together

**B. For the students admitted under PRR20 Regulation:**

**Max. Marks = 20:**

**Pass Marks =**  $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} 07 \text{ marks; if the candidate has a minimum of } 14 \text{ marks in TA out of } 40 \\ 35 \text{ marks out of } 60 \text{ (minimum } 7 \text{ marks in MSE and } 28 \text{ marks in ESE, if the candidate has} \\ \text{ZERO marks in TA out of } 40) \end{array} \right.$

- (i) **BEST MSE MARKS** = max (OTM-MSE marks, previous marks in MSE in which the candidate took OTM-MSE)
- (ii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** = (70% of the max (Best MSE marks, other MSE marks)) + (30% of min (Best MSE marks, other MSE marks))
- (iii) The **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing during permissible years.

**Example:** Consider a case where a student has secured 4 marks in MSE-1 and 6 marks in MSE-2. The consolidated marks secured by the student for MSE is 5.4 (70% of MSE-2 + 30% of MSE-1), which is less than the specified marks. If the student chooses to appear OTM-MSE in MSE-1 and secures 12 marks in OTM-MSE, the evaluation shall be done as below:

- (i) **BEST MSE MARKS** = max (12, 4) = 12 marks
- (ii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** = [70% of 12] + [30% of 6] = 10.2 marks
- (iii) This **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** (10) shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing during permissible years.

**MINIMUM REQUIREMENT OF PASSING A COURSE:**

A student is deemed to have passed a Theory course, if he/she secures

- (i) 35% of marks assigned to the End Semester Examination (ESE) and
- (ii) 35% of marks assigned to the Mid Semester Examination (MSE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) of the course taken together and
- (iii) 35% of marks assigned to Teacher's Assessment (TA), Mid Semester Examination (MSE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) of the course taken together

- 7. After utilizing the OTM-MSE option, **the student should clear the End Semester Examination for that particular course in the subsequent ESE supplementary notification.**
- 8. External marks (ESE) of previous attempts will not be considered to declare the Results once MSE improvement exam is taken.
- 9. **This facility is given as one-time chance only:** If a student has registered, but not appeared for OTM-MSE, then no further chance of OTM-MSE shall be given.
