



**Exam Fee Notification for
 One-Time Make-up chance for MSE (OTM-MSE) Improvement
 in the courses failed due to low MSE marks.**

(Applicable for B.Tech. batches, admitted in 2017, 2018, 2019 & 2020)

Last date to apply for OTM-MSE: 07.09.2024
 (Collect application form from the examination branch)

It is hereby informed to the students of B.Tech. batches, admitted in 2017, 2018, 2019 & 2020 that **One-Time Make-up (OTM)** chance is given to improve the MSE marks (to the minimum required or above).

Eligibility Criteria: One-Time Make-up (OTM) chance is given *Only to those candidates*

- o who have completed their course work, but did not pass some of the courses in the End Semester Examinations due to less marks in MSEs than the minimum required (i.e. 9 marks as per URR-14 & 11 marks as per URR-18) as approved by the Academic Council.
- o Who have not applied in previous OTM-MSE notifications i.e. Date: 23.12.2022 & 13.07.2023.

In this connection eligible students are informed to apply for the OTM-MSE exam(s), by collecting the application form from Examination Branch, KITS, Warangal. Submit the duly filled-in form to the examination branch, KITSW on or before 07.09.2024.

The detailed schedule of OTM-MSE examinations will be released and notified shortly.

Note:

1. Students who secured less than **9 marks** (consolidated) (for URR-14) & less than **11 marks** (consolidated) (for URR-18) in MSE are only eligible to apply for the OTM-MSE examinations for the **concern** courses.
2. For improvement in MSE marks, student has to take either MSE-I or MSE-II (of 2-hour duration).
3. **Results of a course** (for which OTM-MSE taken) **will not be declared based on the MSE improvement marks, i.e., End Semester Examination marks (ESE) of previous attempts of that course will not be considered to declare the results.**
4. After utilizing the OTM-MSE option, student should clear the End Semester Examination for that particular course in subsequent ESE supplementary examinations
5. **This facility is given as one-time chance only:** If a student has registered, but not appeared for OTM-MSE, then no further chance of OTM-MSE shall be given.

Evaluation process of OTM-MSE marks to consider the improvement marks for the calculation of Consolidated MSE marks (as per URR14 & URR18 Regulation) & Minimum requirement for passing of a course (as per URR14 & URR18 Regulation) is demonstrated with example given below:

For students admitted under URR14 Regulation:

Max. Marks for MSE : 25

Pass Marks for MSE: { 09 marks; Provided that candidate secure a minimum of 5 marks in TA (out of 15).
 14 marks; Even if candidate score ZERO marks in TA (out of 15). }

- (i) **BEST MSE MARKS :** Max {OTM-MSE marks, Previous MSE marks (in which candidate took OTM-MSE)}
- (ii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS :** Average {Best MSE marks, other MSE marks}
- (iii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing (in permissible years).

Example: Suppose a student has secured **5 marks in MSE-1** and **9 marks in MSE-2**. The consolidated marks secured by the student for MSE is 7 (i.e. average of 5 and 9), which is less than the required marks i.e. 9 marks to pass in MSE.

If student chooses to appear OTM-MSE in MSE-1 and secured 18 marks in OTM-MSE, then evaluation shall be done as below:

- (i) **BEST MSE MARKS:** $\text{Max}\{18, 5\} = 18$ marks.
- (ii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS:** Average $\{18$ (Best MSE), 9 (Previous MSE2)} = 13.5 marks.
- (iii) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS:** 13.5 marks shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing (in permissible years).

For students admitted under URR18 Regulation:

Max. Marks for MSE : 30

Pass Marks for MSE: $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} 11 \text{ marks; Provided that candidate secure a minimum of 3 marks in TA (out of 10).} \\ 14 \text{ marks; Even if candidate score ZERO marks in TA (out of 10).} \end{array} \right.$

- (iv) **BEST MSE MARKS :** $\text{Max}\{\text{OTM-MSE marks, Previous MSE marks (in which candidate took OTM-MSE)}\}$
- (v) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS :** 70% of the Max {Best MSE marks, other MSE marks} + 30% of Min {Best MSE marks, other MSE marks}
- (vi) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS** shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing (in permissible years).

Example: Suppose a student has secured **5 marks in MSE-1** and **10 marks in MSE-2**. The consolidated marks secured by the student for MSE is 8.5 (i.e. 70% of MSE-2 + 30% of MSE-1), which is less than the required marks i.e. 11 marks to pass in MSE.

If student chooses to appear OTM-MSE in MSE-1 and secured 20 marks in OTM-MSE, then evaluation shall be done as below:

- (iv) **BEST MSE MARKS:** $\text{Max}\{20, 5\} = 20$ marks.
- (v) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS:** $[70\% \text{ of } 20] + [30\% \text{ of } 10] = 17$ marks
- (vi) **IMPROVED MSE MARKS:** 17 marks shall be considered for CIE for all future ESE results processing (in permissible years).


MINIMUM REQUIREMENT OF PASSING A COURSE:

A student is deemed to have passed a Theory course, if he/she secures

- (i) 35% of marks assigned to the End Semester Examination (ESE) and
- (ii) 35% of marks assigned to the Mid Semester Examination (MSE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) of the course taken together and
- (iii) 35% of marks assigned to Teacher's Assessment (TA), Mid Semester Examination (MSE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) of the course taken together
