TRS under TEQIP and DER&IPR under DRDO are research grant schemes for infrastructure creation.

Dr. Prabhu underscored the significance of meticulous grant classification, ensuring a comprehensive approach that caters to diverse research needs and fosters an inclusive environment for researchers.

He provided tips on how to identify and apply for research funding.

He shared his experiences working with different funding agencies.

During the session, he not only elucidated on various funding opportunities but also stressed the pivotal role of networking and cultivating relationships with potential funders, underscoring the dynamic nature of successful research proposal development.

He emphasised on leveraging fellowships and encouraged faculty to actively seek international research experiences, providing invaluable exposure to broaden their academic horizons.
