Appraisal on revised syllabus for B.Tech I year and B.Tech II year under URR-18, Introduction of courses – Essence of Indian Traditional Knowledge, Open Elective with associated Lab, and Programme Skill Development Lab

It was appraised in the previous IQAC meeting (Resolution 2018-IQAC1-3) that curriculum has been revised for B.Tech programmes (CE, ME, EIE, EEE, CSE, IT & ECE) with Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for students admitted from academic year 2018-19 onwards. AICTE model curriculum (*released in January*, 2018) has been considered for all B.Tech. programmes. The First year syllabus was approved by Boards of Studies (BoS) of all the departments, Joint Board of Studies (JBoS) and Academic Council (AC) conducted during June 2018.

Further, for approval of syllabi of courses offered in B.Tech II year programmes (under URR-18 regulation), BoS meetings of all the departments were conducted during May 2019.

The Joint Board of Studies (JBoS) meeting was conducted on 20.5.2019 and finalized the syllabi of all Common Courses offered in II year of B.Tech. 4 year Degree programme.

The Academic Council meeting conducted on 26-6-2019 ratified the above BoS and JBoS approved syllabi of B.Tech II-year of all UG programmes.

Following are the salient features of B.Tech II year courses under revised curriculum:

- Essence of Indian Traditional Knowledge: This is a mandatory course introduced with practical Yoga sessions daily from 5.30 am to 7.00 am.
- *Open Elective with associated Lab:* Open Elective courses are introduced in B.Tech II year with associated Open Elective based Lab.
- *Programme Skill Development Lab:* This Lab is over and above curriculum introduced in B.Tech III semester, to help students improve their programming capabilities using C language.
